The Distinguished Achievers List acknowledges those students who received a Band 6 or E4 (Extension course).

61 students achieved 134 mentions on the Distinguished Achievers List.

Top Achievers

Congratulations to Gemma Morris and Josephine Princi for placing in the TOP 10 in the State in their respective course.

- Gemma equal 8th in Food Technology and
- Josephine equal 9th in Hospitality.



Other outstanding results

- The College performed at an outstanding level with:
 - Food Technology almost 17% above the State mean,
 - Senior Science more than 15% above the State mean and
 - General Mathematics almost 15% above the State mean
- In Senior Science and PDHPE, the combined Bands 5 and 6 compared to the State's aggregate was 61% higher than the State's mean
- In Geography the combined Band 5 and 6 results were 60% higher than the State's mean
- In Society and Culture, 73% of the cohort received a Band 6, compared to just 15% of NSW students
- In Food Technology, 57% of students achieved a Band 6 compared with 7% across the State
- 64% of MSB students studying General Mathematics achieved a Band 5 or 6 compared to just 20% of all NSW students
- 100% of MSB students who studied Geography, Senior Science and Visual Arts achieved a Band 5 or 6.
